Methodology - Semi-structured interviews in CO

The structure of the respondents

- 6 functional cluster organisations
 - interview will be carried out with the cluster manager or other delegated person
 - the sample of five clusters will comprise of the following sectors while each sector will be represented by one cluster:
- 1) **Manufacturing** – traditional (processing) industries with value chains delivering final products to the market;
 - 2) **ICT**;
 - 3) **KETs** (preferably one of the six key enabling technologies: micro and nanoelectronics, nanotechnology, industrial biotechnology, advanced materials, photonics, and advanced manufacturing technologies) or other technology / R&D-based cluster;
 - 4) **Agro-food industries**;
 - 5) **Services** – tourism, spa, health, social work, education, transport & logistic;
 - 6) **Creative & cultural industries**.

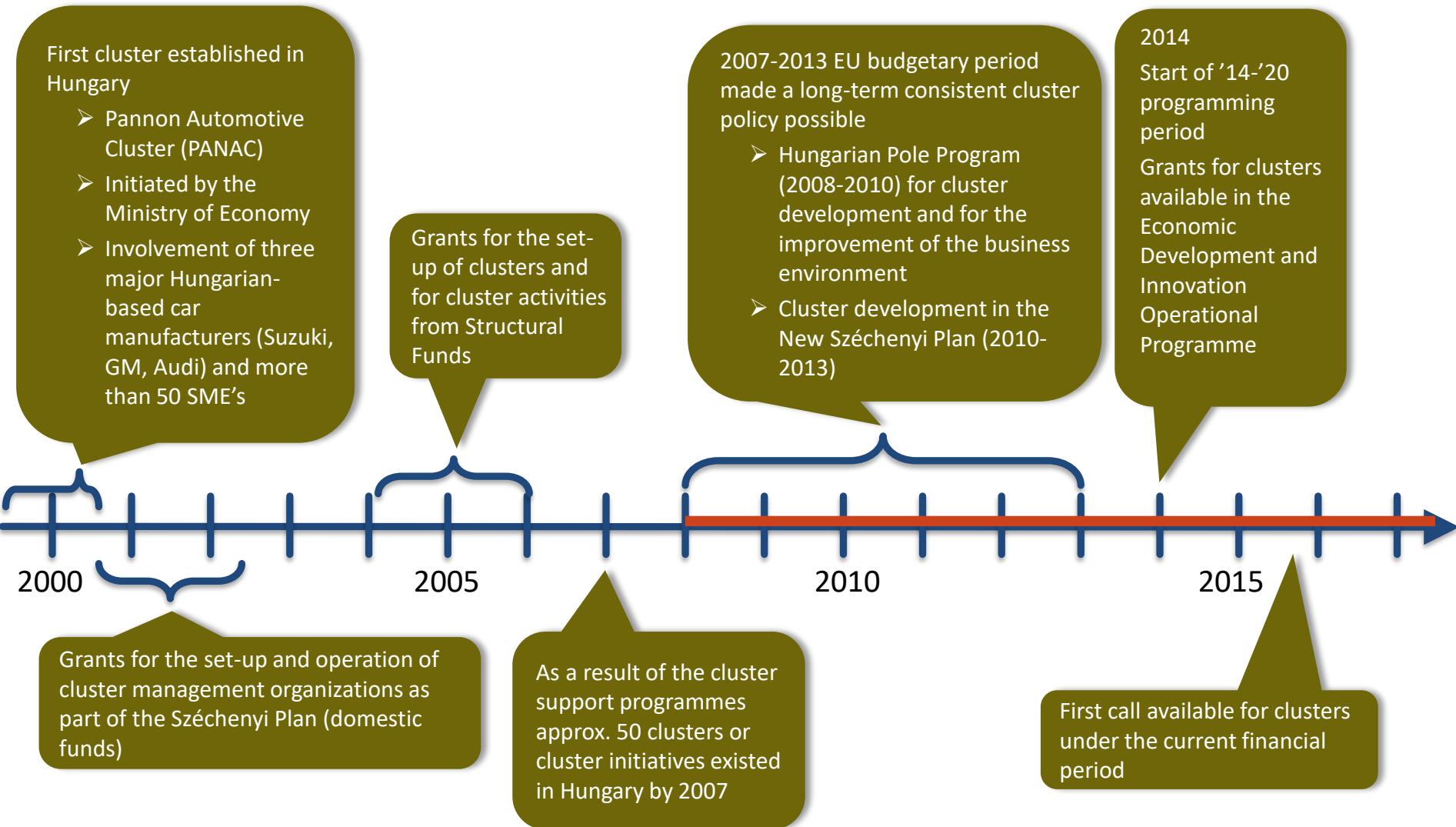

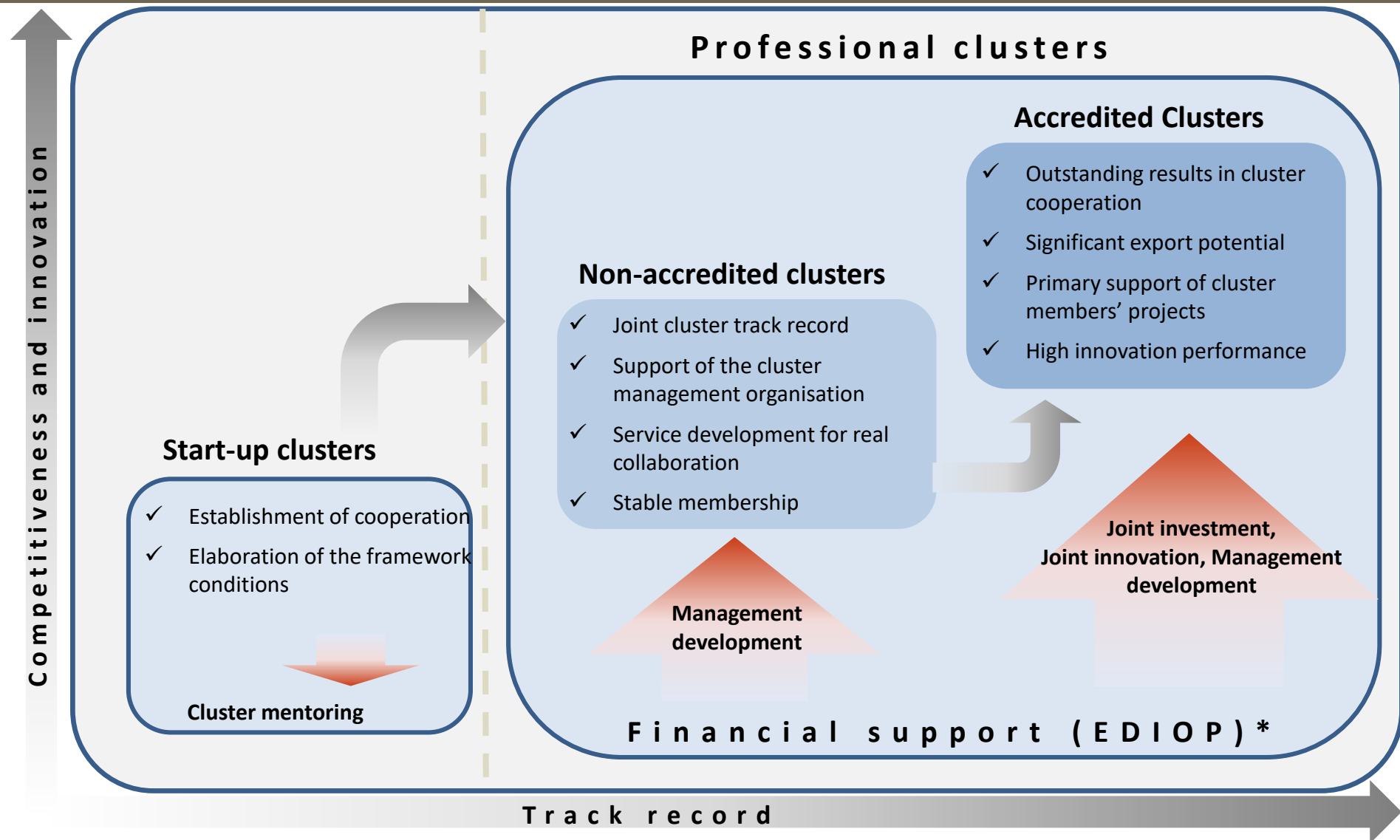
Cluster programmes in Hungary from 2000

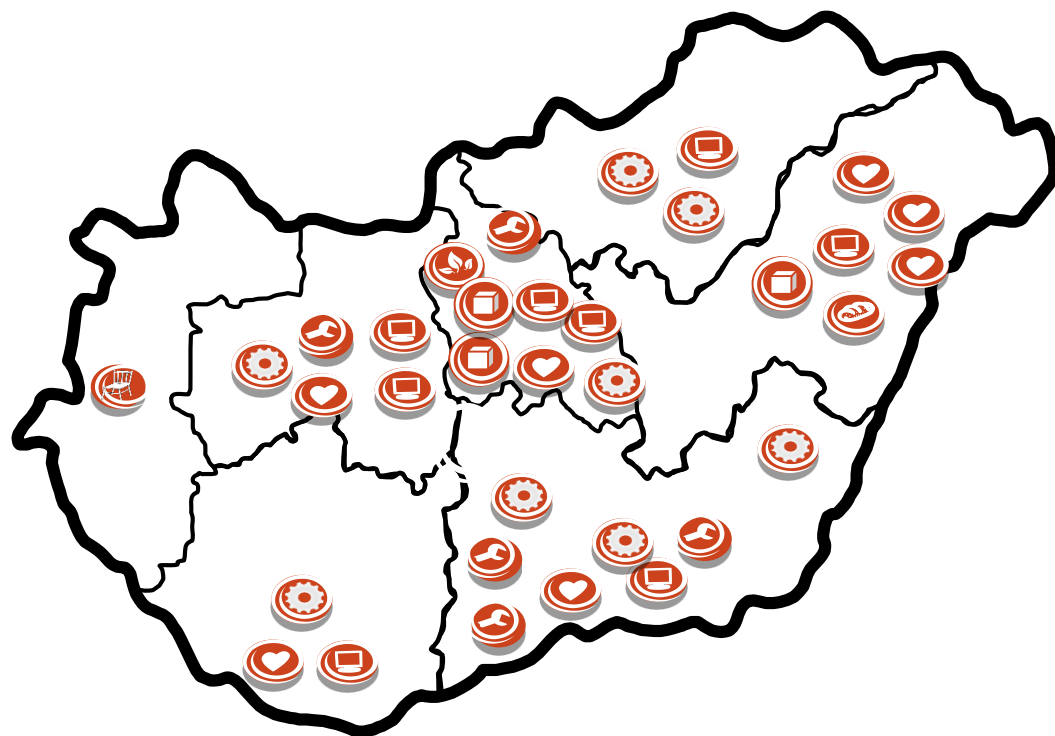
Hungarian cluster development concept 2014-20
